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Background

The Early Years Operational Group (EYOPGRP) was set up in Sutton in 2020/21 and brings together professionals from the local area that are working with families with children aged 0-5 that have or may have SEND. The group discusses families/young children where there are barriers, concerns or issues in relation to accessing resources, intervention or services to problem solve, as well as allocate a pot of Targeted Funding.

The purpose of the EYOPGRP is for colleagues from the council's internal and commissioned services to share information and have solution-focused discussions related to the Early Years Graduated Response (the process of plan, do, review of support in place).

Early Years entitlement funding (including 15 and 30 hours for working parents, disadvantaged children and the universal 3-4 year old funding) comes from the early years block of the Designated Schools Grant. As does the Special Educational Needs Inclusion Funding (SENDIF) pot which is distributed to settings by the EY SEND Advisors.

Targeted Funding, which is distributed by the EYOPGRP, comes from Sutton's High Needs Block and central funds allocated to Sutton for the universal and extended entitlement payments to settings. Settings, with the support of the EY SEND Advisors have been able to apply for this for individual children on a termly basis.

From April 2024 changes announced through the Spring budget in March 2023 have become operational and include the extension of certain funding streams for 2-year-olds, and from September 2024 for 9-month-olds. It is anticipated therefore that the number of children eligible for additional funding for SEND needs, due to the additional entitlement funding, will increase.

The EYOPGRP have therefore considered different models of funding to establish a sustainable and practical way forward for the local area. Feedback from settings about the burden of excess paperwork has also been considered. The proposed changes do not seek to reduce the amount of funding settings receive but to improve the process and equity of distribution.



Current and proposed funding streams

The below provides an overview of the current funding streams and those proposed for the academic year 2024/25. Funding through EHCPs are not included.

FUNDING STREAMS 2023-2024



Special Educational Needs Inclusion Fund (SENDIF)

Funding allocated termly to settings where there are children with identified SEND taking up their free entitlement funding and known to the EY SEND Team, to support inclusion within the setting.



Targeted Funding

Funding to enable flexible, timely support, to achieve specified outcomes, for children presenting with additional needs. This funding is to support a setting's implementation of targeted and some specialist provisions as outlined in the Early Years Graduated Response, for individuals and groups or staff training.



SEND Support Package

Termly payments for children who were identified as being appropriate candidates for a Dragonflies place but did not receive one.



Disability Access Fund (DAF)

Money to support providers in making reasonable adjustments for any child aged three (3) years who is accessing their free childcare entitlement and is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA).



Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP)

Additional funding to support disadvantaged children accessing an entitlement place.

FUNDING STREAMS 2024-2025



Special Educational Needs Inclusion Fund (SENDIF) and Targeted Funding

The pooling together of SENDIF and Targeted Funding which settings will primarily apply for at the whole setting level through provision of a setting wide provision map. There will be less funding available for individual children, as this will be prioritised for a small number of very high needs children (applied for individually). There will be a focus on providing enhanced universal and targeted provision, and increasing ratios for sessions where there is a high number of SEND children.

For 24/25 the funding available is approximately £630,000.



SEND Support Package

No longer available.



Disability Access Fund (DAF)

Remains the same but includes new groups of eligible children (from 9-months).



Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP)

Remains the same but includes new groups of eligible children (from 9-months).

Special Educational Needs Inclusion Fund (SENDIF) and Targeted Funding

This combined pot of funding will be available for settings with children who fit the eligibility criteria and can be applied for collaboratively with the EY SEND Advisor who supports the setting. The EY Advisor will be able to guide SENCOs about interventions to implement, how to group children and training needs of staff.



It is expected that this would be provided from the setting's early years entitlement funding.

UNIVERSAL

- Provision planned for each child and linked to their interests
- Visual supports
- Small group times
- Resources or equipment
- Environmental adaptations



This would be detailed in a setting wide provision map.

ENHANCED UNIVERSAL

- Increased use of visuals and communication prompts
- ABC charts for challenging behaviour
- Targeted small group interventions (using an approach which requires staff training)
- Additional resources or equipment than would usually be available
- Staff training on an approach to be used with all children



This would be detailed in a setting wide provision map.

TARGETED

- Enhanced ratios for certain parts of a session where there is a high number of SEND children
- Regulation support and a calm down space required during each session
- Staff training in a specific approach
- Targeted interventions (delivered 1:1/in pairs or several times during a session)

Special Educational Needs Inclusion Fund (SENDIF) and Targeted Funding cont.

Target+

This would be detailed in a setting wide provision map.

HIGH LEVEL TARGETED

- Enhanced ratios for entire sessions
- Regulation support during each session on a 1:1 basis
- Targeted interventions (delivered 1:1/or with high adult ratios)
- An individualised behaviour plan or communication approach
- Implementation of support plan identified by external professionals



This would be detailed in a setting wide provision map but applied for separately via an individual provision map.

SPECIALIST

- Specialist interventions (delivered 1:1 or several times during a session)
- An individualised and specialist communication approach
- An allocated adult needed to provide supervision to keep a child safe
- Implementation of a Physiotherapy or Occupational Therapy programme



- Children in receipt of early years entitlement funding (up to 4 years old)
- Requests to be agreed with the Early Years SEND Advisor
- Parental consent obtained if making a request for an individual child - settings should use [this parent consent form](#).

ELIGIBILITY

- Enhanced Universal and Targeted levels of funding available to all children who attend Sutton settings, including those who are residents in other local authorities.
- High Level Targeted and Specialist levels of funding are only available to children who are Sutton residents. They may attend settings in other local authorities.

Funding process



- Settings identify children with SEN in their settings and complete the [funding form](#) which overviews the provision required for the setting (see example on the next page).
- Cohort provision maps to be sent to earlyyearsopgroup@cognus.org.uk
- EY SEND Advisors can, if needed, support settings in completing this form and a workshop will be held for all settings to attend should they need guidance.
- The EYOPGP will discuss the funding form and allocate funding



- Settings will be asked to evaluate the provision in place for each tier of children on the cohort provision map at the end of the Autumn term (see example below), in advance of the Spring funding meeting, to detail if they require the same level of funding or if they are requesting changes.
- Should the level of a child's need be higher than originally thought settings should discuss with their EY SEND Advisor.



- Settings will be asked to provide a brief evaluation at the end of the Spring term, in advance of the Summer funding meeting, to detail if they require the same level of funding or if they are requesting changes.



- For children with very high levels of SEND, settings will be able to seek additional funding via an [individual provision map](#) sent to earlyyearsopgroup@cognus.org.uk alongside the completion of this form.
- These will be considered at fortnightly Op Group meetings.
- Children deemed to be eligible for specialist support would be those who have needs which pose a barrier to them accessing continuous provision without some level of adult support. It is likely that their development would be delayed by at least 18 months. Termly evaluation via [this form](#) will be required.

Following funding meetings the setting's Early Years SEND Advisor or EYOPGRP Administrator, will confirm any decisions within two working weeks of the EYOPGRP meeting.

Cohort provision maps will need to be reviewed half-termy, and in some instances a specific intervention/piece of work or training will need to be individually reviewed but the EYOPGP will not require evidence of this to be submitted. Settings will instead be asked to provide a brief evaluation of the impact that the additional funding has had and to detail provision which is still required and areas in which they have needed to make changes.

EY SEND Advisors will seek information about the provision on offer within settings and complete informal auditing as and when they visit settings.

Additional funding for individual pupils should only be requested by settings once they have had discussions with their EY SEND Advisor and it is considered that their additional support needs cannot be provided for, or funded, through the setting wide support. This funding is intended to be for short-term (up to a term) periods of targeted intervention only and will be at a set rate of £2,300 per child per term.

Example cohort provision map

Settings will be asked to provide these termly. This will be the only SEN register you need to submit to claim funding, but you are advised to keep your setting register which will include children who are not eligible for funding.

Funding will be provided at the same amount per term and will be backdated from the start of the term if the request is received within timescales.

Portage Intervention Plus (PIP)
PIP support can also be sought from the EYOPGP when it is considered that all other support options have been exhausted.
